

## SHIN-NY Policy Committee Releases CBO Summary Report of Key Findings

In September, the New York State Department of Health submitted an amendment to the State's 1115 Medicaid demonstration waiver to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) entitled 'New York Health Equity Reform'. The waiver amendment aims to reduce health disparities exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic in good part through investment in social services including those provided by Community Based Organizations (CBOs).

As a result, the SHIN-NY Policy Committee has started to consider several possible policy areas that may pose barriers to CBO participation and the exchange of social determinants of health (SDOH) data via the SHIN-NY. To address the potential policy concerns, the SHIN-NY Policy Committee convened a CBO Roundtable on October 19, 2022. The purpose of the roundtable was to engage social services organizations across NY State in a discussion to identify key policy challenges and data needs for effective data exchange as envisioned by the 1115 Waiver and ways that SHIN-NY policy can support these efforts.

Seventeen (17) CBOs attended the roundtable. The organizations were representative of CBOs that currently participate in the SHIN-NY and/or have some knowledge of the SHIN-NY and reflect a geographic spread that included both upstate, downstate, and north country organizations. A pre-roundtable survey of the attendees was conducted to get a better understanding of services and security practices and to help inform the guided discussion.

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## SHIN-NY Consent Webinar

The Statewide Health Information Network for New York (SHIN-NY) connects the six regional networks in NY known as Qualified Entities (QEs), which allow participating healthcare professionals, with patient consent, to quickly access electronic health information and securely exchange data statewide.

## Technology-Enabled Fall Prevention Virtual Exercise Program Concludes



NYeC is completing a Technology-Enabled Fall Prevention Program thanks to a generous grant awarded by the [Mother Cabrini Health Foundation](#). The ten-week virtual exercise program developed by [Wellness 360 Physical Therapy & Massage Therapy](#) has successfully concluded.

Program participants will continue to be monitored by their Personal Emergency Response System (PERS) wearable technology for the next several weeks. The PERS devices will collect post-intervention falls data which will be compared to baseline data collected at the start of the program with the goal of demonstrating a reduction in the average number of falls for the cohort.

## HEALTHeLINK Study Shows Better Patient Outcomes in CPC+ Practices Utilizing Population Health Management Tools



HEALTHeLINK, with support from the Milbank Memorial Fund, conducted a study to examine if population health analytics helped to improve care quality and efficiency in primary care practices enrolled in the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services' (CMS) Comprehensive Primary Care Plus (CPC+) program. HEALTHeLINK, the health information exchange (HIE) for Western New York, with support from the Milbank Memorial Fund, conducted a study to examine if population health analytics helped to improve care quality and efficiency in primary care practices enrolled in the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services' (CMS) Comprehensive Primary Care Plus (CPC+) program.

CPC+ is a federal program that provided resources and incentives for primary care providers to improve quality, access, and efficiency of care.

The study results show that when a population health management tool and a value-based payment (VBP) model such as CPC+ are in place at the same time, practices tend to have significantly better outcomes as compared with instances where only one or none of the programs are in place.

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## Bronx RHIO Tracks Post COVID-19 Complications in Public Health Surveillance Project



The Bronx RHIO, in partnership with Comagine Health, Beyond HIE, UHIN, and Boise State University, has been awarded a five-year contract with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). CDC's aim is to track and analyze the long-term effects of post COVID-19 conditions on communities in the Bronx and Utah to develop prevalence estimates of post-COVID-19 complications. As the pandemic progresses, it is apparent that there is a need to better understand the lasting impacts of COVID-19 on diverse communities to aid in future decisions about COVID-19 prevention and care. The team will analyze and aggregate clinical data, including social determinants of health information from the HIEs, as well as develop and run cohort studies to observe the impacts of COVID-19 on diagnosed patients over time.

"The coronavirus has placed a disproportionate burden on certain populations, including people of color, the elderly and those with pre-existing conditions," said Marc Bennett, Comagine Health's president and chief executive officer.

"Data from Bronx RHIO will provide critical insight into the long-term impact of COVID-19 on vulnerable groups, in particular racially and ethnically diverse groups with disproportionate high burden of co-morbid conditions and low socioeconomic status," said Dr. Terry Mahotiere, Bronx RHIO's Clinical Director.

Through illuminating these different effects of the pandemic on diverse populations, the team is working to support CDC in collecting and utilizing the acquired information to guide the next steps of healthcare and policy development.

## Hixny Continues Evolving Snapshot with Input from Providers



Earlier this year, Hixny announced its partnership with Healthy Alliance in creating a capability for providers to refer patients to community-based organizations through Hixny's patient record snapshot—a FHIR-enabled application that delivers critical patient data at a glance. With a goal of making exceptional care easier to provide and more efficient, Hixny has continued evolving its snapshot view with direct input from providers. Over the last six months, several new features and capabilities have been added to the application as the result of feedback collected during monthly focus groups and through collaboration with provider groups across eastern New York.

Some of those enhancements include:

- Visits tile, which displays the history of the patient's visits across all settings—including inpatient, outpatient and emergency room visits—since their last visit with the ability to view any associated documents directly
- Care Management indicator, alerting providers whether a patient should be considered for—or may already be receiving—care management services and the ability to click through to view details about contributing data factors
- Vitals tile, offering an immediate view of the most recent vital measurements taken with an option to view available history

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## HealthConnections Continues Support of Public Health Initiatives Through Collaborative Partnerships



Recently, HealthConnections demonstrated its ongoing commitment to supporting public health work through two collaborative efforts. The first involved a community project with the Westchester County Department of Community Mental Health. The project aimed to create a dashboard of hospitalizations and emergency (ED) visits involving opioid overdoses in Westchester County.

The dashboard directly aids the county's Opioid Response and Overdose Prevention Initiative (ORI), created in response to a rise in overdose deaths in Westchester County during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. By utilizing HealthConnections' data, the county was able to pinpoint opioid overdose hot spots and trends and identify communities with the greatest need for overdose support.

Several years ago, HealthConnections built a similar opioid hospitalization report for Oneida County. The new Westchester County dashboard builds from that original solution but presents the data differently by focusing on weekly patterns, allowing the County to examine trends and hot spots that weren't as easily discernable from the previous version.

Secondly, along with other RHIOs, NYeC, the NYSDOH, and external advisors, HealthConnections is participating in the SHIN-NY Public Health Workgroup. The group aims to support State and local health departments across New York. Our goal is to protect and improve the health of our communities by addressing gaps in data to understand and intervene on issues impacting the health and safety of residents.

HealthConnections is pleased to have the opportunity to continue supporting local health departments. Through creating tools and dashboards and being involved in an administrative capacity to help develop new policies and data strategies, HealthConnections continues to demonstrate the innovative use of HIE infrastructure for public health priorities.
